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A map showing the different language groups of the Austro-Hungarian empire. Austria-Hungary before World War I was an empire, the largest political entity in mainland Europe.

The map shows all of Austria and Hungary's official wine regions as well as adjacent regions in Czech Republic, Slovakia, Romania, Serbia, Croatia and Slovenia. Detailed maps of Wachau, Kremstal and Kamptal and Tokaj are included. It established the borders of Hungary and regulated its international situation.

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
